
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

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FROM ARTISTIC DIRECTOR WELBORN E. YOUNG

Planning this season with the board members and the staff has reminded me of the heart, sincerity, and giving spirit that makes this organization remarkable. Every day I am grateful for the opportunity to be "at this table." Rumi's words are a reminder to me how lucky I am to travel the way of the heart.

Collective News

During the summer, the co-directors of GYC, LJ Martin and Claire Jurs were clinicians for the second annual summer music camp hosted by The Choral Arts Collective. The number of young singers present for each of the two weeks was impressive. Singers from first grade through high school rehearsed, engaged in artistic projects, and concluded each week with an "informance" highlighting the singers' musical experiences from the week. In June, nearly one hundred returning and new singers auditioned for Bel Canto Company and Gate City Voices. The range of talent was impressive. Jeff Carlson, Executive Director for the Choral Arts Collective, and I met often to find and walk through potential rehearsal locations that could handle the eighty plus singers in the combined adult ensembles. We are happy and grateful to announce that New Garden Friends Meeting on New Garden Road will be our new rehearsal location. And of course, planning and confirming calendar dates and concert locations for next season occupied some of our summer weeks as well. The artistic staff and Jeff are working to continue the growth and health of Greensboro Youth Chorus, Gate City Voices, and Bel Canto Company.

Greensboro Youth Chorus

All three ensembles, Music Explorers, Apprentice Choir, and Concert Choir are growing and unifying under the leadership of LJ Martin and Claire Jurs. The season is full! Apprentice Choir and Concert Choir held their Fall "Kick-Off" Retreat day in September at Irving Park United Methodist Church. This event provides valuable information for the singers' families and also showcases what the singers do in rehearsal. Beyond the annual December and May showcase concerts, GYC ensembles will be participating in NC-Sings sponsored by the NCACDA at Queens College in Charlotte this October, UNCSA's production of *The Nuteracker* at Tanger Center in December, The Piedmont Invitational Children's Choir Festival in March, as well as various performances of the national anthem at Swarm and Grasshoppers games and outreach performances at area retirement communities.

Bel Canto Company and Gate City Voices

As I write this in September, Bel Canto's first season concert, *Muse*, is coming right up. The musical settings and the poetry serve as a source of joy, peace, and power. Whether

it is something nostalgic we love to revisit every year to remind us of family traditions or discovering new season delights, the holiday concert, *Tidings* featuring Bel Canto Company with Gate City Voices, will warm your hearts. Our planet is a most hallowed space. Bel Canto and Gate City Voices invite several high school ensembles to perform works of their choice in *Sanctuary*. Alex Berko's multi-movement work *Sacred Place* is a setting from various sources of writings about preserving our environment. *Ramblin'* is a captivating program that will take you on a journey through diverse geographical and emotional landscapes as Bel Canto celebrates the spirit of adventure and discovery.

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FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR JEFFREY CARLSON

As I sat in that dimly lit auditorium, I made a decision, one that has shaped the course of my life ever since. It was October of my senior year, and I was the only student from my small-town Nebraska high school to make All-State Chorus. As Dr. Andre Thomas rehearsed the 400+ talented singers in the University of Nebraska's Lied Center for Performing Arts, I realized that my dream of becoming a physicist or engineer – I loved math and science and excelled at both – had suddenly changed. I couldn't imagine not singing every day for the



rest of my life, and as I sang in that rehearsal I decided to major in music. I wasn't sure what exactly I would do with that major – I thought maybe teach high school choir – but I knew that of everything I had been involved with up to that point in my life, music was the one thing I was unwilling to give up.

The rest, as they say, is history. Today I have the privilege of serving as executive director of this incredible organization, now in its 4th season and born from two ensembles with a combined 79 years of history serving the Greensboro arts community. I don't know if Dr. Thomas knew he was changing anyone's life in that rehearsal specifically, but I'm certain he knew it was a possibility every time he made music with others. I'm also sure that everyone reading this can point to at least one example where music affected their life, not just dramatic changes, but also simple moments that are often no less profound. I'm proud that at the heart of The Choral Arts Collective's vision is creating space for lifelong participation in choral music that can lead to those life affirming and sometimes life changing moments.

Last season, the programming of Bel Canto Company, Greensboro Youth Chorus, and Gate City Voices reached more than 3,300 people at 17 Choral Arts Collective sponsored performances, and an estimated 26,000 people at community performances throughout the state. 40 professional singers were contracted to sing in Bel Canto, 42 talented community signers joined Gate City Voices, and 61 K-12 students registered for Greensboro Youth Chorus. This summer 75 students participated in our 2nd annual summer choir camp. We are justifiably proud of these successes, but there is more to do.

In Guilford County there are thousands of students with limited or no access to choir singing or opportunities for music education. Our community is full of talented singers eager for opportunities to utilize their gifts. Audiences throughout the Triad crave exceptional, moving, and entertaining performances celebrating our local talent. We can provide a musical outlet for those currently without, from our youngest singers to our most seasoned concertgoers.

When you invest in The Choral Arts Collective, you make it possible for us to offer potentially life changing musical opportunities. In fact, more than 40% of our annual budget is subsidized through individual support. Quite literally, we cannot do this work without you. Just think, the music you support could be changing someone's life at this very concert!

Thank you for being here today, for your financial contributions, and for all you do for The Choral Arts Collective. We are deeply grateful for and honored by your support.

Old meets new and sacred stands with secular as Bel Canto Company and Gate City Voices celebrate the Triad's outstanding high school conductors and their choirs. We are excited to celebrate and honor the work of the Triad's exceptional music educators in this unique musical celebration.

News regarding North Carolina public high school choral programs is all too often focused on declining resources and budget considerations. We seek to honor the work and diligence of our high school choral musicians and their dedicated and talented teachers. Featured in the first half of this program are the exceptional work and performances of our high school choral guests and their directors. Each ensemble will have the opportunity to shine in a selection of their own. Then their esteemed director will be offered an opportunity to conduct Bel Canto Company and/or Gate City Voices on a piece of their choosing!

This collaborative event also showcases two major selections:

Sacred Place by Alex Berko – Bel Canto Company and Gate City Voices join together to present what the composer describes as "an ecological service that connects the old with the new, the sacred with the secular, and the individual with their community." Scored for chorus, violin, cello, and piano, the central themes of this six-movement work are ecological preservation and healing set within the structure of a traditional Jewish service. Although each movement is titled after a different pillar of the service (Opening Prayer, Amidah, Shema, Mi Sheberach, Kaddish, Closing Prayer), none of the text is in Hebrew. Rather it is a collection of the writings of several environmentalists and poets exploring their relationship with the earth, including Wendall Berry, John Muir, William Stafford, and Rabindranath Tagore.

Proud Music of the Storm by Jake Runestad – Performed by all ensembles and conducted by Bel Canto Artistic Director Welborn Young, this piece is based on Walt Whitman's poem of the same name celebrating the sounds of our world, from nature to music. Runestad describes it as an "ode to all sounds that make up Whitman's world and how they inspired him to create." Like many of Runestad's works, it evokes a deep love for nature and implores the listener to protect its sacred beauty.

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

BEL CANTO COMPANY

Led by Artistic Director and Conductor Dr. Welborn Young, Bel Canto Company is an ensemble of more than 40 outstanding musicians dedicated to presenting exceptional, innovative and engaging choral performances for diverse audiences. We believe in the joy of singing and the power of live choral performances to entertain, inspire, heal, build community, and express that which cannot be expressed by words or music alone.

Now in our 41nd Season, Bel Canto has contracted well over 250 local singers, released 14 albums, commissioned several new works, and performed for prestigious music festivals and conferences throughout the Southeast, including Washington Cathedral's Summer Music Festival, Spoleto Festival USA, The American Choral Directors Association Southern and North Carolina Division Conferences, and the National Endowment for the Arts program *American Masterpieces: Choral Music.* The ensemble has performed with the American Boychoir, the Virginia Chorale, the Greensboro Symphony, the North Carolina Symphony, and has been featured on National Public Radio on Chorus America's *The First Art* and NPR's *Performance Today*.



Bel Canto Company was founded in 1982 by Dr. Richard Cox, then a music faculty member at UNCG, as an outgrowth of the Greensboro Opera Company chorus. The group performed primarily opera and Broadway music, emphasizing solos and small ensembles. This ensemble, sponsored by the Greensboro Parks and Recreation Department, sang one concert that first season. In the same year, David Pegg organized the *Camerata Singers*, whose purpose was to provide Triad music graduates an ensemble that would perform high quality choral music representing all historical periods. After David left Greensboro for Kent State in 1984, the two ensembles joined forces and talents as Bel Canto Company under the direction of Dr. Cox. David returned to Greensboro in 1986 and conducted Bel Canto through the 2004-2005 Season, serving as both Artistic Director and Conductor. Current Artistic Director and Conductor, Dr. Welborn Young, took over after David passed him the baton, both symbolically and literally, at the emotional final concert of the 2004-2005 Season.

Since 1993, Bel Canto has released 14 albums, six of which remain available: *Rejoice and Be Merry* (2011), *American Perspectives* (2012), Dan Forrest's *Requiem for the Living* (2014) which went on to become a top-40 classical album on iTunes, *Radiance* (2016), *Joyful Noise* (2019), and the world premiere of Dan Forrest's *the breath of life* (2019).

In 2021, Bel Canto Company merged with the Greensboro Youth Chorus to form The Choral Arts Collective, a nonprofit organization whose vision is of community celebrating excellence, diversity, and lifelong participation in choral music.

WELBORN E. YOUNG, ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Choral Arts Collective Artistic Director Welborn Young has been the Artistic Director and Conductor of Bel Canto Company since 2005. Critics describe his work as "inspired," "glorious, precisionhoned," "exquisite," and as a display of "...intense attention to details of dynamic shading and rhythmic nuance." He regularly performs a variety of music ranging from large choral-orchestral works such as Bach's *St. John Passion*, Forrest's *Jubilate Deo* and Richard Einhorn's *Voices of Light: The Passion of Joan of Arc* to intimate *a cappella* works.



Under his direction, Bel Canto Company was the annual concert ensemble for Hinshaw Music's Celebration, has performed at Southern Regional and State ACDA conferences, and continues to be a featured ensemble at regional concert series. Concert recordings were featured on National Public Radio's *Performance Today*. Bel Canto Company released six CDs that highlight live performances: *Rejoice and Be Merry, American Perspectives, Radiance, Joyful Noise*, the premiere of Dan Forrest's *Requiem for the Living* chamber edition, and Forrest's *the breath of life* commissioned by Bel Canto Company.

For seven years, Dr. Young served as the conductor of the Choral Society of Greensboro in performances of major choral-orchestral works. He has been a featured festival conductor at the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, at the York Minster International Choral Festival in Great Britain, and at Carnegie Hall. In 1998 he prepared the Grant Park Symphony Chorus in their first recording.

Dr. Young is a guest conductor for honor choirs and is a clinician in festivals and clinics throughout the US. His choirs have toured in Europe in cities such as Florence, Vienna, Budapest, Prague, Cambridge, York, and London. Also a lover of opera, he has worked with Nashville Opera and Greensboro Opera. Dr. Young holds the DMA in Choral Conducting from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. He is Professor Emeritus and served as the Director of Choral Activities and Professor of Music at the University of North Carolina Greensboro where he was the recipient of the 2007 Outstanding Teacher of the Year Award.

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
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GATE CITY VOICES 2024-2025
